Robyn Vivian ACTOR




Azal Dosanjh SET DESIGNER

Jamie Skidmore is an awardwinning artist with over 30 years experience in the theatre. He's a co-founder of the Isle aux Morts Theatre Festival, and is a founding member of the St. John's Shorts Festival. He works as a director, designer, producer, and playwright throughout

Newfoundland and Labrador, as well as in other parts of Canada, the US, and the UK. In 2006 he served as the Production Manager/Technical Director for the Magnetic North Theatre Festival, Canada's National Festival of Contemporary Theatre in English. He has worked with many prominent NL theatre companies and artists, including RCA Theatre, Artistic Fraud of Newfoundland, Perchance Theatre, Grand Bank Regional Theatre, Gordon Pinsent, Andy Jones, Mary Walsh, and more. His current project is a shadow puppet play, *The Kraken*, written by Darren Ivany.



Sara Tilley PUPPET DESIGNER AND BUILDER

Sara Tilley is a multidisciplinary artist from St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada. A graduate of the BFA Acting Program at York University in Toronto, Sara ran feminist theatre company She Said Yes! in St. John's from 2002-2016. She's spent time as an actor, writer,

director, designer, puppeteer, dramaturg, performance artist and Pochinko clown teacher/performer. Sara's written, co-written or cocreated twelve plays, and published two award-winning novels, *Skin Room*, and *DUKE* (Pedlar Press, 2008 and 2015). She trained in puppetry and puppet design at the Banff Centre's Puppet Intensive with Old Trout Puppet Workshop of Calgary, AB, in 2013. In 2015, Sara traveled to Slovenia for a one-on-one mentorship with puppet designer, Darka Erdelji. Sara has created puppets and masks for many of her own plays, as well as for companies like White Rooster Theatre *(St. John's the Rancid)*, Stephenville Theatre Festival (*Jack Meets the Cat*), and RCA Theatre Company (*Belladonna*). Ruth Lawrence is currently co-

producing/directing/writing a TV doc on the St. John's International Women's Film Festival for CBC. She produced & directed The Ennis Sisters music video Shine Your Light to mark the 100th Anniversary of the

CMHA. Since 2009, she has produced a dozen shorts with her company, Blue Pinion Films, including Te Quiero (Tamara Segura), Common Law (Karen Monie), Some Saturdays (Steve Cochrane), multi-award winners *Snowstorm Roulette* (Matt Wright) and *Waiting* Outside (Joshua Jamieson), two RBC MJ Award-winning shorts -Before the War (Tamara Segura) and The Tour (Jenina MacGillivray), and *Quelle Affaire* (an iPhone short she also wrote and directed.) Ruth co-produced *Hunting Pignut*, winner of two best feature awards, with Pope Productions. As Artistic Director of White Rooster Theatre, she has produced, written, and directed for the 20 years with a company dedicated to producing and promoting the work of women and diverse artists. She created the performance walk, Other Women Walk in Bannerman Park, a critical and audience success about women on the margins of the suffrage movement that debuted in 2018. She twice directed an acclaimed production of Berni Stapleton's Offensive to Some for Persistence Theatre. She directed the premiere of a new musical, No Change in the Weather, for a 2019 Canadian tour (Terra Bruce Productions) Ruth shares her skills at many levels, teaching in Artsmarts programs from K-12 as well as being a per-session instructor at MUN and Grenfell Theatre School.
