Visual Guide



This visual guide is designed for visitors going to the LSPU Hall. It contains information about the Hall and lots of images to help prepare anyone who may be anxious (or curious) about their visit. This visual guide also has information to help you to find your way to the LSPU Hall.

The LSPU Hall

This is the LSPU Hall. The address is 3 Victoria Street, St John's, Newfoundland.

Parking

We have free parking for our patrons after 6 pm on weekdays, and on weekends.

- Harbour Drive Parking Lot: Located outside the Fortis Building at Harbourfront and Prescott. 100 parking spaces are available First Come, First Serve.
- Prescott Street (Bluedrop Building) Parking Lot: Located north of Duckworth, behind the Bluedrop Building. 60 parking spaces are available First Come, First Serve.

Walking directions: We're just west of the intersection at Prescott & Duckworth, on the north side. There are a set of stairs between two concrete walls with a mural of an applauding audience. The hall is at the top of the stairs. Alternatively, you can walk down Victoria Street. Our building is at the bottom of the street on the right. The closest bus stops are on Water Street, and Queen's Road. Bus routes 10, 2, 15 or 3.



Inside the Building

This is inside the entrance to the building. It has a small foyer that may be busy before the event. To the left is our box office where you pick up or purchase tickets. You may have to wait in line to be served. To the right there is an entrance to our admin office, as well as the entrance to the Second Space. The Second Space has seating and a bar area. Events are sometimes hosted in the Second Space.



This is the bar area inside the Second Space. You can get a drink here, both alcoholic or non-alcoholic. You can also purchase candy, popcorn, and cookies (depending on the event).



This is the Second Space. Chairs and tables may be set up here during an event where you can sit to wait for the event to start.

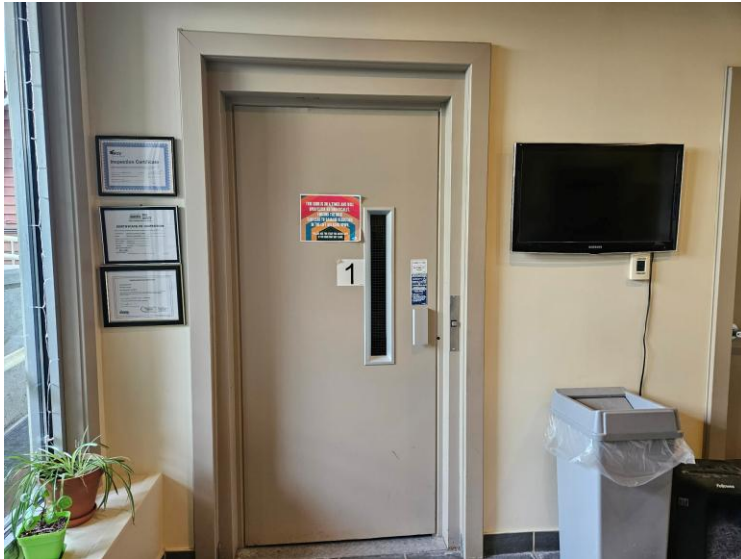


This is the corridor in the main floor of the lobby. There are posters hanging on the walls from shows that have taken place at the LSPU Hall as well as a billboard of community events and information.

At the end of the corridor by the entrance to the theatre are the washrooms. They are both gender-neutral



Our main theatre is upstairs at the LSPU Hall. If you don't want to take the stairs, we also have a lift (elevator) that can take you up to your seat.

If you would like to take the lift upstairs, please let the Box Office know when you arrive and we can have an usher take you up. The lift is slow moving, and it only takes a few moments to get to the theatre.



This is the door to the lift on the second floor.



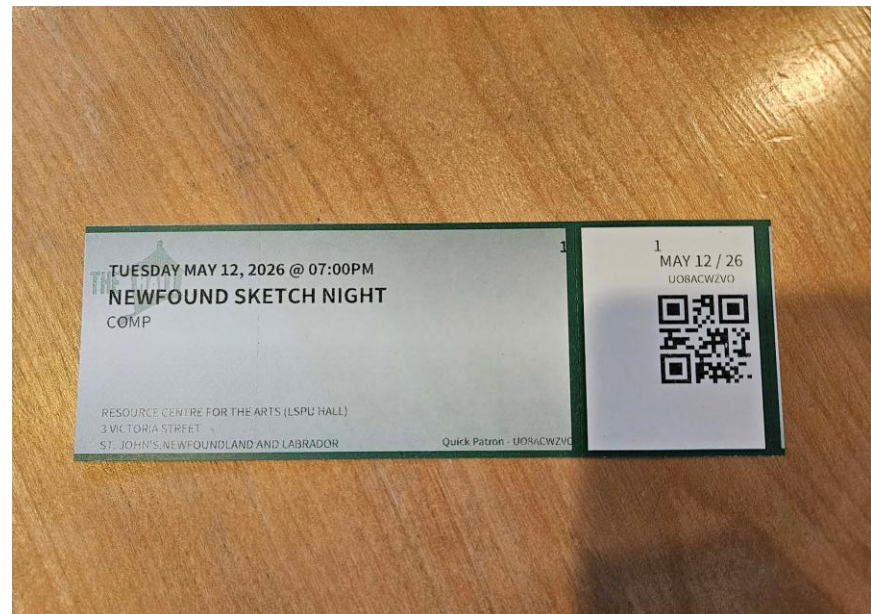
This is the hallway that leads from the lift to the theatre.

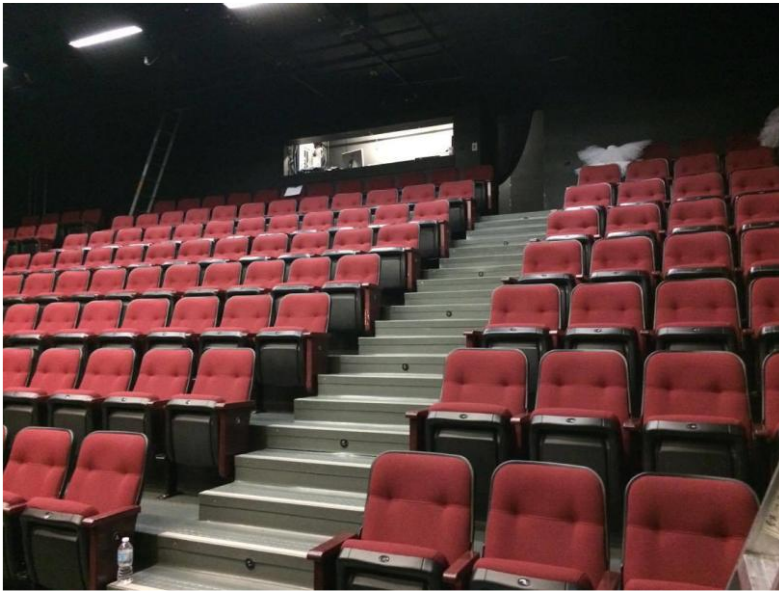
There will be ushers throughout the lobby who can answer your questions and give you directions. An usher will scan your ticket before you go into the theatre and may give you a program if available which will tell you more about the actors and information about the play.

The theatre doors will open about 30 minutes before the show begins. Sometimes they open a little late because the actors are warming up on the stage or the technicians are getting the theatre ready. If you arrive earlier, there are some seats where you can wait in the Second Space until the doors open.

If you need a break during the show, the Second Space is where you can come to have some quiet time.

Your ticket will look like this and will also tell you which section you are sitting in. This example is a general admission ticket, which means you can sit anywhere in the theatre that is available.





This is what the inside of the theatre looks like as you come into the room.



Your row letter is at the end of the row.



You can find your seat number on the seat.



This is what the stage looks like when you are sitting in the audience. The stage is empty in this image, but depending on the event it may be filled with set pieces, actors, instruments, and much more.



We also have a balcony section in the theatre that has a few seats and a door that brings you out to the stairs to get down to the Second Space and washrooms during the show if you need to. Here is a picture of the balcony and the exit door.
